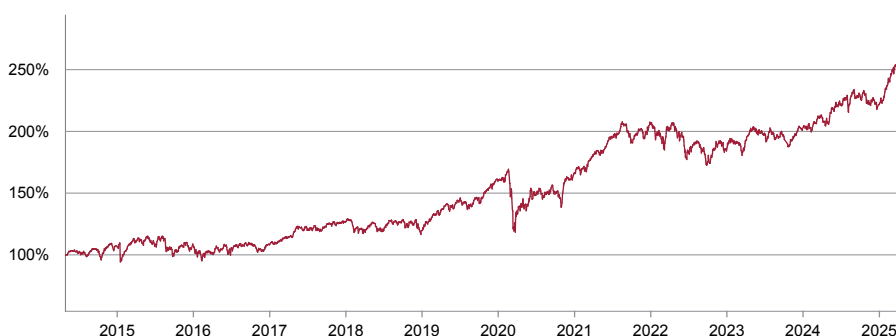
## Investment strategy

The Fund aims to achieve a return on your investment, through a combination of capital growth and income on the Fund's assets, which reflects the return of the SPI® Select Dividend 20 Index (the Fund's benchmark index). The Fund aims to invest so far as possible and practicable in the equity securities (e.g. shares) that make up the benchmark index. The benchmark index measures the performance of shares of publicly traded Swiss companies with high dividend yields. It contains 20 shares selected from dividend paying shares of the Swiss Performance Index (SPI®), which show a certain liquidity as well as a sustainable dividend policy.
